### About the Parent Focus Group Meetings

In January 2016, Superintendent of Schools W. Jeffrey Booker hosted meetings for parents at four school locations across the county.

A Parent Focus Group meeting was held for each "corner" of the community. All schools were encouraged to select one or two parents to represent their child's school at their area meeting. More than 80 parents participated in the Parent Focus Group program.

• The Northeast area meeting on Tuesday, January 5 included the 14 schools in the Mount Holly, Lowell, McAdenville, Ranlo and Stanley areas.

• The **Northwest** area meeting on Thursday, January 7 included the 14 schools in the Bessemer City, Cherryville and Dallas areas.

• The **Southwest** area meeting on Tuesday, January 12 included the 14 schools in the Crowders Mountain and west Gastonia areas.

• The **Southeast** area meeting on Thursday, January 14 included the 13 schools in the east Gastonia, Belmont and Cramerton areas.

The Parent Focus Group meetings gave parents an opportunity to share their ideas and ask questions in a small-group setting, which led to engaging discussion about our schools.

Superintendent Booker began each meeting with an introduction and overview of Gaston County Schools. He also highlighted progress made in areas such as Academics, Communication, Technology, School Safety, and Community Involvement since he became Superintendent two years ago.

The following pages provide a summary for each area meeting and outline the topics discussed by parents. Collectively, parents were most interested in academics and curriculum, facilities, issues related to funding, technology, instructional resources, and support programs for students.

The Parent Focus Group meetings are part of the school district's on-going efforts to "continue the conversation" with parents, students, employees, business/community leaders, and others about public schools in Gaston County.

The information from parents is extremely important to have as the school district plans for the 2016-2017 year and beyond.
