The district includes 10 high schools, 1 alternative school, and 2 innovative high schools located on the community college campus. There are 30 elementary schools and 11 middle schools. Gaston County also offers a Virtual Academy for online, remote school and a community-based vocation training school that serves special needs populations.

Bessemer City High School is a four-year public school and serves approximately 562 students in grades 9-12. Bessemer City utilizes 4x4 block scheduling where each student attends 4 classes daily for an entire semester.
