

The High School

North Gaston High School is a public high school in the Gaston County Schools school district located in Dallas, North Carolina, United States. Its attendance range covers the central portion of northern Gaston County. Of the graduating class of 2024, 40% of students continued their education at a community college or technical school, 28% enrolled in a four year public or private university and 32% of students joined the workforce or enlisted in a branch of the military. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, North Gaston partnered with the Franklin Covey Foundation to be a Leadership School of Distinction. The school wide initiative allows for every student to participate in a Lead class throughout the year. Students will have the additional opportunity to complete the Covey Leadership curriculum and earn credentials upon graduation.

School Demographics

North Gaston High School is located in a rural community. Current student enrollment of 1,070 with 21% of students being of Hispanic/Latino descent, 44% White, 27% African American and 8% of students coming from Native American, Asian or biracial backgrounds.

2024-2025 Graduation Requirements

Students select a concentration pathway in Academics, Fine Arts or a Career/Technical Education by taking 4 classes in the concentration area. All students are required to complete a minimum of 28 credits to graduate and to meet the following graduation requirements:

School Year

North Gaston High School operates on a 4x4 block schedule, with students receiving instruction in four 90 minute classes, earning four credits each semester. Students have the opportunity to earn 32 credits in four years.

Class Rank

Rank is based on an average of final marks in courses beginning with 9th grade. Grade point averages are calculated on a traditional 4.0 scale. When calculating the GPA, weighted courses, denoted by asterisk(s) on the transcript, receive an additional 0.5 points for honors courses and 1.0 points for advanced placement or college courses.

Unit of Credit

One unit of credit is granted for each course successfully completed.
