This handbook outlines the objectives, expectations, content, grading, and rules of our department. It is the responsibility of department parents and students to read and review this handbook in its entirety, to ensure that there is a full understanding of department rules, expectations, and procedures. By holding a place in the program, you must consider that another student within our school may have the misfortune of missing out on opportunities that you're receiving. With that being said, failure to adhere to any of the procedures or expectations in this handbook can and will result in removal from the program, as well as loss of recommendation to the high school program.

Success is inevitable when students are supported and encouraged to put forth their best effort in <u>ALL</u> that they do -- not just limited to core academics and athletics.

PLEASE NOTE that the end of this handbook contains documents that need to be returned to the classroom by <u>AUGUST 31, 2018</u> for each student's first homework grade. Failure to return the documents by the deadline will result in a "0". Late documents will be accepted, but a reduced grade will be supplied.

OUR CLASSROOM. OUR CULTURE.

The Dallas community is fortunate to honor values of friendship and family. I believe that it is important to honor those values, not only within our community and school, but also in our classroom. Our goal for this school year is to spread positivity and acceptance as effectively as possible through our shared love of music and arts. The Chorus classroom is a safe space for all who enter. Students and families are encouraged to keep the director updated with facets of life that could impact the student or classroom environment. With this being said, RACIST, HOMOPHOBIC, AND SEXIST COMMENTS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED. Any reports of the aforementioned comments will be discussed in between the director, the reported student, (if necessary) an administrator, and (if necessary) the reporting student. Such comments could lead to in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension, and/or removal from the Choral Arts Department at the school's earliest convenience, dependent upon the determined severity of the issue.

In other words, it is a lot smarter to choose words wisely and to think before speaking or acting. Treat others as you would want to be treated and with the utmost respect.

At the end of the handbook, you will find a Behavior Contract, which will need to be signed and returned by the August deadline in order to hold the student's spot in the program. If the contract is not returned, the student will need to conference with the director to determine if continuation in the program is an option. If it is deemed that the student will not continue in the program, a letter of recommendation to have the student relocated into another class will be given to administration and sent home on behalf of the department.

If a department member requests to be removed from the program, they will be required to wait until the end of the semester. The decision of where the student will be placed is that of administration and is based on current class sizes. The student will receive a placement in one of the following Encore courses: Music Appreciation, Career/Technical Education (CTE) courses, Visual Art, or Spanish.

At the end of the first semester, students will be evaluated based on their performance and participation within the department. If a student's evaluation is determined to be 'unsatisfactory', the director will send a letter to the parent(s)/guardian(s) outlining any issues that are prohibiting success, to which the family and director will dually decide on the students continuation with the department.

As previously mentioned, we are striving to build a community based on positivity and acceptance. We are all different in many ways. No individual should be forced to feel as if he or she doesn't belong. Any interference with this goal will result in removal from the program to reduce the level of toxicity.

THE CHORAL EXPERIENCE

at W.C. Friday Middle School

ENCORE CLASSES are offered to any student who shows interest in participating in Chorus while in middle school and has been recommended by other teachers or selected by the director. Students will not only be exposed to various kinds of music, but will also receive lessons in music theory and fundamentals, music literacy (learning how to read and write music), ear training, vocal training and techniques, and other related elements. Depending on preparedness, 7th and 8th Grade participants will be required to attend NC Middle School Large Ensemble Music Performance Adjudication in March, where ensembles will sing before a panel of judges and other NC middle school choral programs. Afterwards, ensembles will receive a score and a rating.

YOUNG MEN'S ENSEMBLE is a select ensemble, open to 7th and 8th Grade male department participants and is limited to 20 members. This ensemble meets everyday, during the school's Advisory period. In addition to learning repertoire, students will receive additional lessons in theory and ear training, as well as more attention to healthy vocal production during the voice changing process. This ensemble will be required to attend NC Middle School Small Ensemble Music Performance Adjudication in March. Similarly, the group will sing for one judge and receive a score and a rating. At the end of the semester, all members will be re-evaluated to aid in the decision-making process for continuation during the following semester.

YOUNG WOMEN'S ENSEMBLE is an <u>auditioned</u> ensemble, open to 7th and 8th Grade female department participants and is limited to 20 members. This ensemble meets every Tuesday and Friday, after school. In addition to learning repertoire, students will receive additional lessons in theory and ear training, as well as more attention to healthy vocal production as the female voice matures. Similarly to Young Men's Ensemble, this ensemble will also be required to attend NC Middle School Small Ensemble Music Performance Adjudication in March, where they will also receive a score and rating from a judge.

6TH GRADE SMALL ENSEMBLE is a <u>select</u> ensemble open to male and female department participants within the 6th grade Encore classes. The group is limited to 20 members, who will represent the W.C. Friday Middle School Choral Arts Department at NC Middle School Small Ensemble Music Performance Adjudication in March. The group will rehearse as necessary, but will only sing unison and two-part repertoire that is learned during traditional class periods.

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

OUR MOTTO

Singing together to sound as one.

[By working together through our love of music, we have the ability to heal a soul.]

DEPARTMENT EXPECTATIONS AND MATERIALS

Be here, not there:

Participation in Chorus requires your attention at all times. This class is comparative to team sports: each student is a valued player of the team, the teacher is the coach, rehearsals are practice periods, and performance through music is our objective.

By focusing on other aspects of school or social situations, you aren't completely present for the practice. The mentality of each valued player is what makes the team successful. Without you, the entire team risks suffering a loss.

Be ready:

Required materials <u>ALWAYS</u> include your voice, your attention, <u>a spiral-bound notebook</u> (dedicated to Chorus), <u>a pencil</u> (ink pens are not acceptable), and your chorus binder, which is supplied and left in the classroom. **REFILLABLE WATER BOTTLES ARE HIGHLY SUGGESTED** but aren't required.

You are required to be in your seat with your materials and working on any opening assignment by the five-minute mark. Failure to do so will result in grade deductions.

Positivity and Maturity:

We all have "off days", but that's no excuse to not attempt to make the best out of it. When you enter the classroom, leave other concerns behind and be prepared to listen and work. A huge part of your grade is performance-based. You perform for me daily, through your voices and your actions.

Follow all directions that are given and insinuated. Conduct yourself with respect, dignity, and maturity. You are not only a representative of our school, community, county, and state, but you also represent yourself and your family.

RULES AND CONSEQUENCES

Students will enter the classroom with a calm demeanor and prepare themselves for the work experience by retrieving their required materials and completing any opening assignments that are provided.

Students **WILL NOT** eat food, gum, or candy during any portion of the class period, unless permission is granted by the teacher. Any of the aforementioned items will need to be discarded immediately if they are consumed.

Students **WILL NOT** drink beverages during any portion of the class period, with the exception of non-flavored or carbonated water, which must be in a drinking container with a lid.

Students are not allowed to play the piano or use any classroom equipment without first requesting permission from the teacher.

Students **ARE NOT** allowed on the stage, unless the teacher gives permission. This will result in an automatic referral and be considered "skipping class".

Students **WILL NOT** talk during instructional or rehearsal time. If anyone has an appropriate question or comment regarding anything that occurs during the class period, they are to raise their hand and wait to be called on by the teacher.

FAILURE TO ADHERE TO ANY OF THE RULES ABOVE WILL RESULT IN THE FOLLOWING CONSEQUENCE SEQUENCE:

Parent/Guardian contact will occur with all consequences following "Verbal Warning".

DEPARTMENT PROCEDURES

At all times, all Gaston County Schools and W.C. Friday Middle School rules and policies apply to every choir member.

Entering Class

<u>All students will enter the classroom in a respectful manner.</u> Singers are to retrieve their binders and other required materials and make their way to their assigned seat, where they will complete any work that is presented on the board. If no work is displayed, they are to quietly wait for instructions to be given or for class to begin.

Bookbags

Per W.C. Friday Middle School policies, bookbags are not allowed in the classroom and are to be left in lockers during the school day, with the exception of the last class period of the day. At this time, they are to be left in the back of the classroom, on the steps... in, under, or near chairs.

Tardiness and Attendance

All classes are expected to be in their seats with their materials at the five-minute mark (the first five minutes) of the start of the class period. Assigned attendance takers will take attendance at the beginning of each class period and chorus function. Tardy students are to report to the teacher immediately. Students who present a validated teacher/administrator note will be excused. However, those who don't present a note will receive a 5-point deduction from their daily participation grade, which is out of 20 points, which will roughly average 75% for the day.

Materials

Each grade level has a class set of 1" 3-ring binders, which will contain sheet music and two pencils. Each student is assigned a binder and is responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of it and its contents. Lost binders will need to be replaced for a fee of \$2.

Restroom and Water

Students will receive 5 passes for the semester, which will allow access to the restroom or to get water. After these passes are used and unless an approved doctor's note is presented or an emergency arises, they aren't allowed to use the restroom or get water during the class period until the following semester. Students are asked to use the restroom and get water during lunch or transitional periods in the hallway, while taking potential tardiness into consideration. The teacher reserves the right to postpone a restroom break to a more appropriate time, even with a pass.

Assignment Submission

Some assignments will need to be submitted electronically via Google Classroom. Most often, assignments will be submitted into the appropriate submission bin or drawer in the classroom. Any assignment that is submitted past its deadline will result in a lowered grade.

Rehearsal

The more we hear and listen, the better we sound. Rehearsal time isn't time to socialize with fellow students. Respect the director, other students, and yourself by not disrupting the learning environment -- you will be removed. Mark your score as instructed by the director. This will help you as you rehearse and memorize music. It is important to remember that you signed up to learn and sing music outside of what you already know. Commit to fully learning a piece before you pass judgement about it.

Money Submission

If a student needs to turn in money for festivals, fundraisers, fees, etc., he/she will retrieve a payment envelope from the deposit box, fill it out with the required information, seal the payment in the envelope, and deposit it into the box. A receipt will be available upon request.

Dismissal from Class

At the end of each class period, students will be responsible for ensuring that their area is clear of trash, binders, music, etc., and that their chair is correctly placed into the row. The teacher will dismiss by row or section. Students are not to rely on the bell for dismissal. Leaving before teacher dismissal will result in an automatic referral for "skipping class".

Cell Phone/Electronic Use

Use of electronics that aren't supplied by the school are prohibited during the school day, unless permission is granted by staff. These devices are to be kept in lockers. Students will not receive warnings for having their devices out, and instead, will be expected to give the device to the teacher. The device is then given to the front office and will need to be picked up by a parent or guardian. Failure to give devices to the teacher will result in an automatic office referral for "defiance".

DEPARTMENT APPAREL

Concert Attire

6th Grade Participants:

<u>Department Polo</u> (it is suggested that you order a size to carry you through your "choral career" at W.C. Friday, as it will be used on various occasions in the future -- <u>\$20 each</u>)

<u>Black Dress Slacks or Skirt</u> (no joggers, leggings, sweatpants, or jeans will be allowed.)

<u>Black Dress Shoes, Flats, or Low Heels</u> (no tennis shoes are permitted... all shoes must be closed-toe.)

Please keep makeup and jewelry to a minimum, and be sure to keep your hair out of your face -- a ponytail or updo is suggested.

7th Grade & 8th Grade:

Black Dress Shirt or Blouse (no t-shirts or tank tops)

<u>Black Dress Slacks or Skirt</u> (no joggers, leggings, sweatpants, or jeans will be allowed... dresses are allowed to substitute.)

<u>Black Dress Shoes, Flats, or Low Heels</u> (no tennis shoes are permitted... all shoes must be closed-toe.)

<u>Purple Accents</u> (Young men will wear a purple bow tie and young women a purple scarf -- <u>\$10 each</u>)

At various points throughout the year (outlined in the Department Calendar), students will be required to wear their concert attire to receive a test grade. This is to ensure that we are performance ready.

Informal Attire

All department members will be expected to purchase a department t-shirt, which will be worn at various in-school and community performances, accompanied by nice jeans... no rips, holes, or writing.

If families have any issue purchasing any of the attire listed above, please contact the school or Mr. Cornelius as soon as possible to receive assistance.

ASSESSMENTS & GRADING

Grades may be checked on PowerSchool by parents and students at any time. WCF teachers are encouraged to update grades often. However, your child's posted grade may not reflect the most updated information. If at any point you'd like an updated average, feel free to contact me.

As per the Gaston County Schools Grading Policy, grades are calculated on a weighted 10-point scale using the following weights and categories:

Dress Down Days happen around one month prior to major performances. During these days, students are required to wear their performance attire to school. In return, they will receive a test grade according to how "in-tact" their attire is.

Projects will be scored in two parts: "research and organization" and "presentation". The research and organization portion of the project will come after the student has completed the research and has built their presentation. The presentation portion of the project will come post-class presentation.

Artistic Work Habits are averaged daily grades by week. Students can receive up to 20 points per day, resulting in up to 100 points per week. This grade is affected by in-class performance and participation. A rubric has been created and included in the handbook.

Sight-Reading and At-Home Practice are both completed at home or outside of class time. Students will receive a sight-reading exercise that is to be submitted electronically by the end of each week. Periodically, students will be asked to take home sheet music to practice for performances. They are to return to school, having practiced the piece. Failure to bring the music back to school will result in an automatic 10-point deduction from his/her daily grade.

Absences and Attendance (continued)

Students automatically receive 20 daily points for being in attendance and participating in the class period. However, in the event of an absence (excused or unexcused), he/she will need to complete a make-up assignment per absence to earn the points back. These make-up assignments will need to be submitted at least one week prior to the closest report card distribution day.

Attendance at all performances is required and graded. Absence requests for mandatory performances must be submitted via handwritten note from a parent/guardian at least two weeks prior to the performance. The absence will require the completion of a make-up assignment. Until the assignment is completed, a "0" will hold the place of the performance in the gradebook.

Additional rehearsals may be planned prior to major performances. While these rehearsals aren't mandatory, it is in the student's best interest to attend the rehearsal for as long as he/she possibly can.

PARENTS AND STUDENTS ARE REMINDED THAT CHORUS IS, INDEED, A GRADED COURSE.

Students are to notify Mr. Cornelius of any practices or games that will interfere with performances or rehearsals WELL AHEAD OF TIME. I will do what I can to work with coaches to compromise rehearsal and practice times.

FIELD TRIPS AND TRAVEL

The department will have various opportunities to travel this year. Specific dates will be listed in the department calendar. Below, you'll find descriptions of each event.

<u>Wingate University Fall Visit:</u> Every fall, I take the Advisory period to Wingate University to see the opera department's annual performance or to work with a professor and view an ensemble at work. This allows our students exposure to see music and how it works on a professional level. This trip generally costs around \$10 and includes lunch on campus, whether it's eating at the cafeteria or ordering pizza.

NC Middle School Honors Chorus: Students who display proficiency in performance and music literacy are invited to audition for the NC Middle School Honors Chorus, which is held in Winston-Salem, NC, during the NC Music Educators Association's annual conference. Families are responsible for covering travel and hotel costs. These students also receive first priority in attending another state/county ensemble of their choice if they aren't chosen to participate in the ensemble, post-audition.

<u>Wingate University Middle School Choral Celebration:</u> Staff at the WU Music Department select middle schools around North and South Carolina to attend and participate in a two-day long rehearsal and performance. This event typically costs around

<u>Vocal Solo/Small and Large Ensemble MPAs:</u> Vocal Solo/Small Ensemble participants travel to Stanley, NC and Large Ensemble participants travel to Hickory, NC to sing before judges and receive performance ratings. In most cases, Large Ensemble participants will take part in group sight reading sessions, where they will also receive a score. Prices for this event vary, but can range from \$2 per person for ensemble members to \$30 per soloist.

NC Middle School All-State: Students will travel to Greensboro, NC during the Friday and Saturday of Spring Break to participate in one of three ensembles. Students are not auditioned, but will be removed by state officials if they don't know their repertoire. Families are responsible for travel and hotel costs, depending on the number of students who are invited to attend.

<u>Gaston County Middle School All-County:</u> Students will participate in a men's or women's ensemble with other middle schools from the county. This trip generally costs around **\$5** for dinner during the evening rehearsal.

SUPPORT & VOLUNTEERING

Parents – please consider donating your time and/or talents. Our group is the largest program at WCFMS. The master calendar reads many events, fundraisers, concerts, field trips, and more that need parent volunteers. Additional information about becoming a volunteer will follow in an email.

- All GCS rules and WCFMS rules apply to every choir member at all choir functions.
- Follow all instructions of the director, chaperones, or other adults who are a part of the trip.
- Performance is an outgrowth of the program. Some performances may be scheduled at other locations during the school day. Each choir's work ethic and sense of responsibility and maturity will impact trip opportunities.
- Field trips will not count as a school absence.
- Students receiving inadequate grades in chorus or on a report card in another subject area will not be eligible to travel with the choir. If the director or another teacher feels it is in the best interest of a student to remain in class on field trip day, it will be so.
- Chaperones will accompany the choir on field trips. They will be considered as authority figures and treated with respect.
- If a performance is scheduled for an entire ensemble, every member of the ensemble is
- required to attend. This includes overnight trips.
- Trips that cost money will be announced with adequate enough time for students to participate in a payment plan and/or fundraise the cost
- All students will ride the bus together to any destination. Students who do not wish to ride the bus home from any event may do so only if there is 1) written notification prior to the event, and 2) the event ends outside of the normal hours of the school day. Students will only be released to a parent or guardian.
- All students will be responsible for keeping the bus clean and orderly.
- The use of illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia or alcohol or knowingly associating with a person or persons who are using illegal drugs or alcohol while on the chorus trip will not be tolerated. If such use or possession takes place in the presence of a SCHS chorus student, it is that student's responsibility to report the use or possession of the illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia or alcohol immediately to a chaperone or other trip official.
- The use of any tobacco product is not allowed at any time on the trip.
- Be where you are supposed to be before you are supposed to be there.
- Keep up with your personal belongings.
- It is your responsibility to make sure your director knows where you are at all times.
- Use of degrading, profane, or "off-color" language is unacceptable.
- Complaining will not be tolerated.
- Do not invite non-chorus trip personnel (those not approved by the director) to come to the hotel, restaurant, or any other place where the Chorus is located.
- When a student misses other SCHS classes for a Chorus activity, they are expected to ask
 their teachers before they leave for the chorus activity what they will miss. They are then
 expected to complete and turn in the work when it is due. There is a form for this.
- If school is in session the day after students return from a night chorus activity, students are expected to be in class the following morning.

For overnight trips involving hotel stays, the SCHS chorus has an additional set of policies to ensure student safety. These policies will be sent home prior to each overnight trip along with a travel contract.
