- Wednesdays from 8am to 11am.
- Due to pandemic, they are currently doing it as "drive-thru".
- "Walk-in" individuals/families just show up no need for referral or appointment.

- Monday to Friday from 10am to 1pm, closed on Wednesday.
- Must be residents from the North Belmont, Springwood area.
- "Walk-in" individuals/families just show up no need for referral or appointment.
- Verification/Documentation required: Photo ID.
- Resident/client can go once every two months.

Food - Soup Kitchens

- Free soup kitchen (no fee).
- Provided everyday (Monday Sunday) after the service at 8pm.
- Provide groceries and hygiene bags every night.

- Belmont area only.

- Food, clothing, medicine, furniture/household, & utility bills.
- Open M-F, 9 am 1 pm.

Bessemer City Crisis Center, 315 E. Virginia Ave., Bessemer City, NC, 704-629-2147

- Monday to Friday; Monday 10am to 2pm (by appointments only); Tuesday to Friday from 10am to 4pm.
- Client has to go to the store and fill out an application.
- They must be a Bessemer City resident.
- Assistance provided with water bill, power bill, and medicine.
- Verification/documentation they must provide: ID for every individual in the home, Social Security card of every individual in the home, proof of income, and proof of address (water bill, lease agreement).
- It is free no small fee.
- For individuals ages 65 years and under, they can go once every three months. For individual ages 65 and over, they can go once every month.

Cherryville Area Ministries, 212 N. Mountain St., Cherryville, NC, 704-435-3816

- Only for residents in Cherryville.
- Verification/documentation they must provide: photo ID for all over 21 in the home, Social Security card for all in the home, proof of income and proof of address for all over 21 in the home.
- Rental assistance: rental/lease agreement must be taken as documentation.
- Assistance with food, clothing, utilities, gas, medication, and rental assistance.

Crisis Assistance Ministry, 805 W. Airline Ave., Gastonia, NC, 704-867-8901

- Hours of operation: 9am to 2pm Monday to Thursday; closed on Friday and weekends.
- Based on a first come, first serve basis.
- Only for Gastonia residents.
- Verification/documentation they must provide: Photo ID, Social Security card of everyone in the home, and for those who work, a month's pay stub.
- Individuals/Families have to go in person.
- Depending on what they are needing assistance in, dictates how often they are able to get weekly/monthly assistance from the agency.

Dallas/High Shoals Christian Ministry, 305 E. Trade St., Dallas, NC, 704-922-1236

- Food distribution will occur outside in a drive-thru manner.
- Food, hygiene, and monetary donations are accepted to provide to customers. No clothing or household donations accepted at the moment due to pandemic.
- Hours of operation: Tuesday/Friday from 9am to 12pm; Wednesday/Thursday from 2pm to 6pm .
- Facebook page information: Does not limit how many times you can get food assistance, nothing is needed to get food from them during this time.
- All Gaston County residents can receive food.

- Assistance with food and clothing only.

Mt. Holly Community Relief Organization (CRO), 2120 Spring St., Mt. Holly, NC 704-827-0450

- Website information:

- Hours of operation: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 9am to 12:30pm.
- Provides short term emergency assistance to solve crises.
- Training is offered in various areas budgeting, interviewing skills, nutrition, goal setting.
- Assistance with food, financial, and pharmacy.
- Residents of the City of Mount Holly only.
- Food: The individual requesting assistance must be the head of household, provide proof of crisis and income verification.
- Financial: Personal interview and assessment procedure are done.
 - *o* The CRO provides financial assistance for rent/mortgage, utilities, water, and heating fuel. Assist people in obtaining affordable housing through rent and utility deposit assistance.
 - *o* Persons seeking financial assistance will undergo an interview process to determine the need, available resources, involvement of other agencies, and a plan to move them towards relative independence.
 - Documentation required for interview: Photo ID; Proof of crisis (ex. proof of hospitalization, doctor's note, car repair bill, etc.); Proof of household income for last and current month; As many bills and receipts from last and current month as possible to show how the household money has been spent; Rent/mortgage, utility bill information (late notice, cut-off notice, and/or eviction notice); Deposit information (Have Section 8 housing, must take proof of the inspection.); If receiving disability benefits and have a payee assigned, the payee needs to be with them for the interview; Written prescription or prescription bottle with refills still available if seeking medication assistance. CRO does fill prescriptions for insured individuals and we do not fill any controlled substance prescriptions.

<u>Internet</u>

Charter Spectrum Offering

- Free high-speed internet service up to 100 Mbps for 60 days, beginning March 16, to households that do not already have a broadband subscription and have children in grades K-12 or in college. Standard installation included.
- For eligible low-income households without school-aged children, Charter continues to offer Spectrum Internet Assist, a low-cost broadband program delivering speeds of 30 Mbps.

Due to pandemic:

- They are working to limit exposure.
- Are keeping programs open for as long as they can to assist people.
- Residents and staff are following CDC guidelines until further notice, such as wearing gloves and cleaning regularly.
- Normal hours (nothing different right now).
- <u>Daily Meals Hours</u> (Monday to Friday) are the same. Only difference is for the non-residents eating at 5:30pm, they are being handed a plate to take with them they cannot eat at the Salvation Army to limit exposure.
- Intake Hours: Monday to Friday from 1pm to 3pm.
 - o Housing: Started doing drug testing because it moves availability for families
 - o Emergency shelter
 - · Intake process (background check)
 - Start with entry program of 30 days- 60 days 90 days
- Provide assistance with food, clothing, rent, and utilities.
 - o For rent and utilities, it is based on *funding availability*. Individuals have to call the Salvation Army to verify that there is still funding available. If so, they have to go on either Wednesday or Thursday and sign in to receive funds.

Women's Shelter, 704-852-6000

Due to pandemic:

- Regularly cleaning.
- Residents are signing in and out by phone.
- Not limiting the number of families in the shelter because of the pandemic, they're just taking extra precautions.
- Normal hours (nothing different right now).
- All individuals who call, have an intake process. For those that do get into the shelter, they do a safety plan and additional resources/services in the shelter. For those that *do not* get into the shelter, also do a safety plan and are given additional information about other shelters and resources in the community.
