Global Payroll Issues:

Retirement Contributions

- ORBIT (NC State Retirement) files have been submitted through June / posted through May
- Empower (Prudential) 401(k) posted through
 September. All other retirement plans 457 and
 403(b) posted through June

Multiple Voluntary Deductions

- A number of employees had excess deductions taken from their checks.
- We are working with Oracle and CherryRoad to correct the issue for future pay cycles.
- Some of these have been refunded, but many have not. We will be working with our on-site Oracle resource to assist us with refunding these excess deductions.

Longevity Payments

- No longevity payments were made to employees in July and August.
- We are working with CherryRoad to resolve this issue as soon as possible.
- The issue was resolved for September longevity payments.

EPI Teacher Deductions

- Since EPI teachers are contract employees, they are not subject to pay FICA deductions during their first two years, or any retirement contributions. However, we did withhold FICA and retirement from most of these individuals.
- We are currently refunding these deductions to these employees.

Classified Employee Issues

 The General Assembly approved salary increases amounting to the greater of 4% or \$15.00/hour
 These salary increases have been entered into Oracle

All salary increases will be retroactive back to July 1, 2022

Classified Employee Issues

 School Nutrition employees were not paid the higher rate of pay for summer school. This rate has been entered into Oracle and should be reflected in the next bi-weekly pay slip.

In an effort to resolve outstanding issues and minimize ongoing issues, GCS has taken the steps detailed in the following slides.

We created an Customer Service Team to personally visit schools to meet with employees that have experienced payroll-related issues.

As of October 17th, our Customer Service Team has visited 36 schools. All schools will be visited by the end of October.

The Customer Service Team also plans to support our Central Office supervisors so they can document any concerns from their employees.

We plan to have these visits completed by the end of October as well.

The week beginning October 10th we began working directly with Oracle (in addition to CherryRoad) to resolve several of our payroll issues.

Oracle has also sent on-site support to assist the payroll department beginning today. We will have this on-site support for about 20-25 business days.

The Oracle on-site support will be used to:

- Identify and correct existing payroll issues;
- Assist GCS with the reimbursement of excess deductions to our employees;
- Enhance existing payroll procedures to improve the efficiency and accuracy of future pay runs.

Based on the information and questions gathered by the Customer Service Team, we have created a FAQ document to address many common questions and concerns.

We have also created videos and descriptions on how to read and understand the Oracle pay slips.

Both of these items are included in the Oracle GCS Handbook with is available to all employees.
