Specifically, a candidate must be serving in one of the following capacities: Student body president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer; Class president, vice-president, secretary, or treasurer; Student council representative; or Student representative elected or selected/appointed (selected/appointed by a panel, commission, or board) to district, regional, or state-level civic or educational organization. Also, the student must be: A permanent resident of the United States, Currently be enrolled in a public, private, or charter school in North Carolina, and have at least one parent or guardian who is a legal resident of North Carolina.

**National Achievement Scholarship Program (Juniors)** *Discipline:* General *Award:* \$2,500, and some corporate sponsors award scholarships to those students pursuing specific careers. *Requirements:* Competition is for black Americans. Take the PSAT as a junior and request entry to the Merit Program. **NC State General Hugh Shelton National Leadership Scholarship** *Discipline:* General and Leadership *Award:* valued at \$5,000 per year, renewable upon satisfactory academic progress and leadership involvement. *Requirements:* Leadership, evidence of personal character and integrity, community service, personal growth, physical fitness/wellness, commitment to the program; High school seniors should complete the **admissions application AND PackAssist application by October 15, 2019** Between the months of November and December, the Shelton Leadership Center Staff and Board of Advisors will select students to be invited to apply for the scholarship. Students will have two to three weeks to complete and submit the application on-line through PackAssist. The invitation to apply for the scholarship will be sent through the student's NC State email account from PackAssist. Students will be asked to complete additional short-essay questions by the end of December. **(Students may wish to apply earlier to N. C. State).**

Must commit to pursue a bachelor's degree at an accredited institution. *Award:* \$6,000 (13 awarded) *Requirements:* To be eligible to apply for the Horatio Alger North Carolina Scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria: Be enrolled full time as a high school senior in NC; be progressing normally toward graduation in spring/summer of 2019 with plans to enter a college in the US no later than the fall following graduation, exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree at an accredited non-profit public or private institution in the US (students may start their studies at a two-year institution and then transfer to a four-year institution), demonstrate critical financial need (\$55,000 or lower adjusted gross family income is required) be involved in co-curricular and community service activities, display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity, maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0, be a resident of the State of NC; and be a US citizen. *Deadline:* **October 25, 2019** *Contact:* Visit online at <http://scholars.horatioalger.org>

## Important Dates and Information

- College Night Presentation by HST Counselors for Seniors and Parents - Monday, September 9th at 6:00**
- College Day at Gaston College - September 24, 2019 - at Gaston College - Turn in Permission Slip ASAP**  
Juniors and Seniors will attend a College Fair at Gaston College - (Juniors 9:00 - 9:30) (Seniors 11:00-11:30)
- Take/Retake the SAT or ACT** as soon as possible. Take them in **October** and at least twice - SUPER SCORE!
- Create an [Activity Sheet](#)** and send a copy to your School Counselor by adding it in Google Classroom.
- Apply Early!** Many Colleges have early application deadlines on **October 15, November 1, and November 15** for early notification. Some schools require you to complete the application by the early deadline to be eligible for merit scholarships.
- Request recommendations** from teachers if necessary, giving them as much notice as possible. Also give them a copy of your [Activity Sheet](#) AND [Brag Sheet](#). (Activity Sheet and Brag Sheet Templates are on the Counseling Website)
- Check each College's website** for admissions and scholarship/financial aid information.
- Send your transcript electronically** through [www.cfnc.org](http://www.cfnc.org) for NC Colleges.
- Register for Private College visits at HST** - <http://bit.ly/hstcollegevisits>
- Get prior approval before any Off Campus College visit.**
- All Seniors planning to attend College should complete the FAFSA** - FAFSA becomes available on - October 1, 2019 - <https://fafsa.ed.gov/> Create a FSA ID -<https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa/filling-out/fsaid> - Both student & Parent need an ID.
- FAFSA Day** - Financial aid administrators will be available on FAFSA Day, **Saturday, October 26 from 9-12** to walk you through the FAFSA process. This event will occur at Gaston College. If you need help completing the FAFSA you should register here - <https://www.cfnc.org/fafsaday> Visit the website and click the FAFSA button to register and to find specific location details.
- RDS - Residency Determination Service - Do this before you apply to College!**  
Everyone applying to a NC college will need to complete RDS to get in state tuition or state grants at private colleges. You will use your CFNC username and password to login to RDS. Parents should not create a new CFNC account for you!!!  
**Residency Determination began two years ago:** students who wish to be considered in-state residents for tuition purposes must verify their residency through the new Residency Determination Service (RDS). **We recommend that students complete the residency verification process (available at [www.NCresidency.org](http://www.NCresidency.org)) and obtain their Residency Certification Number (RCN) before applying.** This way, students can enter their RCN when filling out our application on CFNC. **This process is important because a student's residency status determines their cost of tuition and eligibility for North Carolina-supported financial aid.** Contact 844-319-3640 or 919-835-2290 for troubleshooting.
