March 2017 - Grant Guidelines

GASTON COUNTY EDUCATION FOUNDATION Ron L. Ensley Grants

Deadline for all applications: Wednesday, April 12- 5:00 pm - Sharp!

No grants will be accepted after April 12 at 5pm.

All grants must be submitted from 2017 guidelines and applications

Winners will receive notification by May 23- Awards reception - June 12

- Requirement Submit 3 complete copies of the grant application with only one cover sheet containing school and teacher information. All grants go to Dana Luoto at the Central Office!
- Classroom teachers and other non-administrative personnel who work directly with students may apply.
- Over \$40,000 in grants will be given this year

Grants are awarded for innovative teaching initiatives that enhance classroom learning. We look for originality and creativity! The Education Foundation does not fund field trips.

- Education Foundation Board Members serve as judges. They are business and community leaders who are looking for creativity and measurability.
- In some cases, partial grants will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.
- All grants are judged without knowledge of the applicant. Cover sheet with school information is removed before judging. If school is acknowledged in grant text, it will be disqualified.

Please note!! Grants will be awarded at two levels of funding:

- <u>Individual classroom teacher grants will be awarded up to requests of \$750</u>
 If a recipient leaves the school where they serve to go to another Gaston County School, the grant follows the teacher. Otherwise, the grant funds must be returned to Education Foundation.
- PLC, grade level and team grants will be awarded up to \$2000 Concentrating on team, grade level and PLC related initiatives in education.

A teacher may receive only one individual grant and may only be part of one PLC Grant
