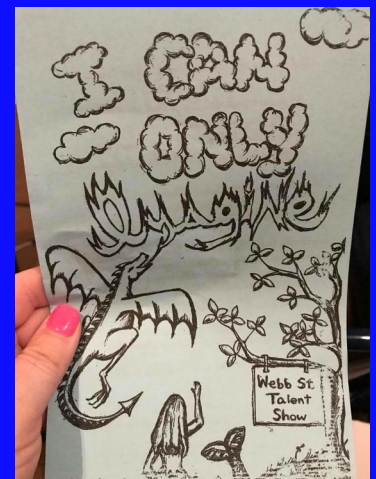
PTO Corner
