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The Gaston County Board of Education will hold its regular monthly meeting on Monday, August 17, 2015, 5:30 p.m., at the Gaston County Schools Central Administrative Office, 943 Osceola Street, Gastonia. At that time, the Board will . . .

  1. More than 1,200 teachers and administrators attended the **Gaston County Schools** Teaching and Learning Conference held August 11-12 at Gaston College. The conference featured keynote speakers and professional development workshops.
  2. **Gaston County Schools’** summer reading program, “Camp Achieve,” served nearly 1,100 students in first, second and third grades. The four-week program held at eight school sites helped students to improve their reading and comprehension skills.
  3. A group of middle school and high school teachers and counselors participated in the “Educators in the Workplace” program, which is a partnership between **Gaston County Schools** and the Gaston Chamber of Commerce. Participants were given an opportunity to learn more about the local business community through visits to eight companies: American & Efirm, PSNC Energy, Firestone, *The Gaston Gazette*, ImageMark, Beam Construction, Lanxess and CaroMont Health.
  4. The Gaston STAGE summer theater program at **Stuart W. Cramer High School** presented the musical “Anything Goes.” The professionally directed production featured 26 students from eight schools.
  5. For the first time, **Gaston County Schools** sponsored an AP (Advanced Placement) Summer Writing Camp. Rising seniors enrolled in AP courses learned effective writing strategies for tests and college and scholarship essays.
  6. **Grier Middle School** hosted its Sixth Grade Transition Camp for new middle school students and their parents. Approximately 90 students participated in the program.
  7. **Grier Middle School** and **Sherwood Elementary** received a donation of school supplies valued at \$1,000 from First Presbyterian Church of Gastonia.
  8. **Robinson Elementary** received a \$1,000 grant from Walmart in support of efforts to promote reading.
  9. Instructional technology facilitators **Chris Goodson** and **Lisa Montgomery** and **Mount Holly Middle School** teacher **Heather Wilson** served as advisory group members for the “Teaching Generation Z: Active and Digital Learning” conference sponsored by the N.C. Center for the Advancement of Teaching. They also presented two sessions at the conference: “Gaming Across the Curriculum” and “Getting Stakeholder Buy-in for Game-Based Learning.”
