- Receive the following Good News:
- 1. The **Gaston County Schools** graduation rate increased for the fifth consecutive year. The graduation rate for the Class of 2014 is 83.5 percent, which is the highest rate ever for the school district. Since the state first calculated the graduation rate in 2006, the GCS rate has jumped 15.4 points from 68.1 to 83.5 percent.
- 2. **Gaston County Schools** has more students achieving proficiency and more schools making academic growth, according to the READY state testing and accountability program. For the 2013-2014 school year, GCS had 78 percent of schools (39 of 50) to meet or exceed academic growth. The district had 63 percent of schools to achieve growth the previous year.
- 3. **Forestview High School** student **Abigail Cross** was named a semi-finalist in the National Merit Scholarship program.
- 4. **Grier Middle School** is participating in the EarlyAct FirstKnight character education program. The program uses a Renaissance-era jousting theme to teach students about justice, courage, honor, tolerance and kindness. Grier is the first middle school in the state to participate in the program, which is sponsored by the Gastonia Rotary Club.

- 5. The Gaston Early College High School won the 2014 Jostens National Yearbook of Excellence Award. The Early College is one of only 19 schools in the state to earn the national recognition. **Russ Paul** is the school's yearbook adviser.
- 6. **W.A. Bess Elementary** received 45 gift packages filled with school supplies from Elevation Church in Gastonia. Church pastor Ken Hester presented the supplies to the school.
- 7. **Lowell Elementary** sponsored a school beautification project to prepare for the new school year. A team of school volunteers and members of Epic Church spent time planting flowers and spreading mulch to beautify the school grounds.
- 8. **Highland School of Technology** senior **Morgan Young** received a scholarship from the pre-pharmacy program at Wingate University. Senior **Victoria Rule** earned a merit scholarship from Mars Hill College.
- 9. **Highland** student **Jennifer Chan** is a semi-finalist in the Create-A-Greeting-Card Scholarship Contest. Chan, who is a student in the school's graphic design program, created a greeting card for the online competition. The winner will receive a \$10,000 scholarship.
