The Gaston County Board of Education met in a work session on Monday, January 7, 2019 at Bessemer City Central Elementary, 1400 Puetts Chapel Road, Bessemer City, NC. Those Board members in attendance were: Chairman Brent Moore, Vice Chairman Kevin Collier, Dot Cherry, Justin Davis (arrived after the meeting was in progress), Lee Dedmon, Steve Hall, Jeff Ramsey and Terry Usery. (Dot Guthrie absent)

Additional attendees include: Superintendent W. Jeffrey Booker, Attorney Sonya McGraw, Associate Superintendents Dr. Melissa Balknight, Gary Hoskins, Assistant Superintendent Cindee Matson, Chief Communications Officer Todd Hagans and Board Clerk Dana Luoto.

Chairman Moore called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and welcomed everyone.

Agenda Adoption - Action

The Board considered Agenda Adoption - Action

Motion to adopt the Agenda as presented was made by Ms. Dot Cherry seconded by Mr. Jeff Ramsey motion carried unanimously. (7-0)

Chairman Moore thanked Principal Caroline Black for hosting the Board Meeting. Ms. Black reported that everyone loves the newly renovated media center which includes an innovation stem lab.

Resolution - School Calendar Flexibility - Information

Chairman Moore recognized Mr. Todd Hagans who read a Resolution Supporting Local Control of School Calendars.

Whereas, the North Carolina General Statutes give local boards of education powers of supervision and control of local school systems; and

Whereas, local control over establishing school calendars is an integral component of school system supervision and administrative powers with which local boards of education have been vested; and

Whereas, in 2004, the North Carolina General Assembly seized control of setting school calendars and imposed a one-size-fits-all mandate on how school calendars are to be set; and

Whereas, the current one-size-fits-all school calendar start date is no earlier than the Monday closest to August 26 and the end date is no later than the Friday closest to June 11; and

Whereas, the state-mandated late August start date means high schools do not complete the first semester until mid to late January; and

Whereas, the current law essentially requires high school students to take first semester exams after the winter break, which negatively affects test scores, according to students and educators; and

Whereas, the second semester for high school starts two to three weeks later than community colleges and universities; and

Whereas, superintendents report that the calendar misalignment makes it extremely difficult for high school students or recent winter graduates to take courses at a nearby community college or university during the second semester; and

Whereas, in Gaston County, students, parents, teachers and others have indicated the importance of local control of the school calendar so the first semester of school could end before the winter break; and

Whereas, exams for Advanced Placement classes are given on the same day nationwide, and the current calendar law shortens the amount of time North Carolina's students have to learn the material before test day; and

Whereas, with little flexibility built into the calendar, scheduling make-up days is extremely challenging; and

Whereas, schedules for extracurriculas such as fall sports and band have not changed to coincide with the state-mandated school calendar law; and

Whereas, local boards of education are best equipped to understand the balancing act of meeting the community's needs and maximizing student success; and

Whereas, restoring local control of school calendars will allow local boards of education to best meet the calendar preferences of the families, educators and businesses in our community while allowing for innovative experimental approaches to improve student achievement.

Why should I apply for a Choice opportunity?

School choice provides a wide variety of educational programs to students based on their interest. These options offer students the opportunity to attend a Gaston County School Choice program with other students who share similar academic and career goals.

How do I apply for a Choice Program?

Applications are available online through the Gaston County Schools website. Families will be able to complete the process by using a computer, tablet, or mobile device that has internet access.

I would like to apply for a Choice Program, but I do not have access to a computer.

Families without access to a computer or have questions about the application process, may contact The Office of Student Assignment at 704-810-7284.

If my student is accepted into a Choice Program, will he/she be eligible for Athletics?

Students accepted into a Choice Program will be eligible for Athletics. Academic and attendance eligibility still apply.

Will students be able to participate in Visual and Performing Arts classes (Band, Chorus, Dance, and Visual Arts)?

Yes, each each student will have opportunities to select elective courses. Students have enough electives in high school to take classes in both their School Choice Academy and also have Visual and Performing Arts. We encourage students to consider participating in an arts program. It is important that students are well rounded.

Will transportation be provided?

Students outside of their attendance area will be responsible for providing their own transportation.

I will be eligible in the 2019-2020 school year to participate in a School Choice Program, will I be able to participate in the Academy offered at my assigned school district?

Yes, families must apply to express interest in the program. Each Choice Program has reserved seats for families in the assigned district school.

Will my child be able to move back to his/her home school at anytime?

It is important that students who apply for a Choice Program are committed to completing a school year. Class scheduling, teacher assignment, and course selections are created based on enrollment.
