



#### Increased Proficiency and Growth

#### **Proficiency:**

Since 2013-2014, Gaston's proficiency rate has gone up almost six points, increasing from 50.2 to 56.0.

#### **Growth:**

Last year Gaston County had 87.8 percent of its schools (43 of 49) to meet or exceed academic growth expectations. This was the highest growth rate by any of the 10 largest school districts.


