The Gaston County Board of Education met in a regular session on Monday, March 16, 2020 in the Board Room, 943 Osceola Street, Gastonia, NC. Those Board Members in attendance were: Chairman Brent Moore, Vice Chairman Kevin Collier, Dot Cherry, Justin Davis, Lee Dedmon, Dot Guthrie, Steve Hall, Jeff Ramsey and Terry Usery.

Additional attendees include: Superintendent Dr. W. Jeffrey Booker, Attorney Sonya McGraw, Associate Superintendents Melissa Balknight, Gary Hoskins, Chief Communications Officer Todd Hagans and Board Clerk Dana Luoto.

Chairman Moore called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and welcomed everyone. Chairman Moore thanked Superintendent Booker, senior staff, school administrators, teachers and the entire GCS family. Everyone has adjusted their schedules to make difficult decisions and stepped up to provide leadership and guidance during this time of uncertainty. Dr. Booker congratulated students Sydney Lester of South Point High School and Baylor Wyatt of Ashbrook High School; both won the United States Congressional Gold Medal.

Dr. Booker congratulated Cherryville High School student Peyton Huffman who received the South Central All-District Band Scholarship.

Classroom Moment - Information

Superintendent Booker recognized Dr. Melissa Balknight who presented a PowerPoint on Gaston at Home our new digital platform for learning during the COVID-19 pandemic. Discussion followed.

Superintendent Booker recognized Mr. Joey Clinton who gave an update on Human Resources. Mr. Clinton reported the following:

The state has given us some local decision making power regarding how to proceed with the opening of schools. Today, we chose an optional teacher workday so our teachers and teacher assistants could come in and work if they chose to. Tomorrow, will be an optional work day for all employees (full time and part time) which will include school nutrition staff and bus drivers. We will be making decisions on how we move forward day by day. Employees not working today could use a sick day, annual leave day or compensatory time (if earned) for classified staff. We are also working with principals and employees on being aware of self-regulating their own health and the health of their employees. Principals have talked with their employees and are taking care of the people in their buildings. If employees have questions about quarantine, employees should call Human Resources so they can discuss options on an individual basis. Human Resources has been in contact with Humana, our employee assistant provider, to provide employees with an opportunity to receive counseling as anxiety continues to rise. Discussion followed.

Superintendent Booker recognized Mr. Gary Hoskins who gave an update on Operations. Mr. Hoskins reported the following;

Effective Tuesday, March 17 Gaston County Schools will be providing a "Grab and Go" meal to all children while our schools are closed due to the coronavirus. Meals can be picked up from 10:30 a.m. – 12 noon weekdays until Friday, March 27 unless school closure is extended by the Governor at the following locations: Bessemer City High, Carr Elementary, Cherryville Elementary, Erwin Community Center, Grier Middle, Robinson Elementary, Tabernacle Baptist Church, Woodhill Elementary, Kiser Elementary, North Belmont Elementary and Warlick Academy. A GCS yellow bus will be in the front parking lot of each of these locations so meals can be picked up; meals will packed so they can be taken home to eat. The "Grab and Go" service will operate much like the summer feeding program intended to help families that depend on School Nutrition for feeding their children. There is no charge for any student and meals can be picked up at any location regardless of where the student attends school. Information on "Grab and Go" can be found on our website. Discussed followed.

Chairman Moore opened the floor up to Board Members to ask any questions they might have. Discussion followed.

Superintendent Authority for Actions Related to COVID-19 - Action

Chairman Moore recognized Vice-Chairman Kevin Collier who read the following statement:

This agenda item calls for the Board to authorize the Superintendent to take any lawful action and to temporarily suspend Board policies as necessary in response to potential risks associated with the Coronavirus with the understanding that the Superintendent would continue to keep the Board informed of any such actions. The purpose of this measure would be to enable the Superintendent to act expeditiously as necessary to implement appropriate response measures. This would be for the safety and well-being of our students and staff. These are unusual times which call for this Board to take extreme measures to empower our Superintendent to take actions necessary to keep our students and staff's well-being our priority. Boards across North Carolina are entering into similar authorizations with their Superintendents.

The health and well-being of our students, staff and communities where we live and serve is our highest priority. As concerns about Coronavirus (COVID-19) increase, we are taking additional precautions to keep all of our families safe while supporting the educational needs of our students.

To support Gaston County Schools students while our school buildings are closed, we are providing a continuity of learning plan called Gaston At Home.

What is Gaston At Home?

Gaston At Home is a remote learning opportunity to allow students to continue learning beyond the walls of the classroom. All materials will extend learning opportunities previously stught by classroom teachers. These review materials will help to deepen your child's understanding and prepare them for the end of year standardized assessments. While students are engaged in Gaston At Home, assignments will be provided by the school and may be completed virtually or via paper and pencil.

What are the best practices for Gaston At Home?

- Create a consistent schedule and learning space for your student.
- Allow students to work in increments of 20 40 minutes at a time.

Where do I obtain my Gaston At Home assignments?

Students will receive a hard copy packet from their school. In the event that a student has lost his or her packet, all materials are posted on the Gaston County Schools website at www.gaston.k12.nc.us.

Do you have internet access?

Spectrum is offering free broadband and Wi-Fi access and will be available for 60 days to households with K-12 and/or college students who do not already have a Spectrum broadband subscription at any service level up to 100 Mbos. To receive this service. call 1-444-48-8305.

Do you need additional reading and curriculum resources?

Mackin Educational and Follett Destiny have partnered to offer free electronic resources for all students. Using a student's email address, they may access Follett Destiny resources offered through their school. From each school's web page, students can access these online resources, which include over one thousand ebooks for pleasure reading and for curriculum support.

Additionally, the Gaston County Public Library offers all GCS students a WOW (WithOutWalls) card that allows access to various types of ebooks and periodicals. Students may also access these resources using their school email address.

Ongoing Expenditures

State Mandated Increase in Employer Benefits:

Next year employer provided benefits is expected to increase by \$483,000 as follows:

- Health insurance is expected to increase by
 5.4% from \$6,306 to \$6,647
- Retirement contribution is expected to increase by 9.0% from 19.70% to 21.44%



Ongoing Expenditures

Replacing End-of-Life Mobile Devices:

- Based on the date placed in service, we estimate about 5,900 devices will need to be replaced.
- The cost of replacement is about \$180 per device, or \$1,067,000.



Ongoing Expenditures

Expected Inflationary Impact:

- The expected inflation rate for next year is about 2.1% for other goods and services.
- The estimated impact of inflationary costs on our purchases of goods and services is \$165,000.





Ongoing Expenditures

Teacher Assistant (TA) – Increased Days:

- Increase TAs from 200 work days per year to 215 work days per year
- This would result in an additional \$310,000 in local funding that will be paid by GCS next year.






Teacher Salary Supplement:

- The average GCS teacher salary supplement still falls below the State average and our peer group.
- The County has agreed to a series of \$500,000 increases in the salary supplement to get our teacher supplements more in line with our peer group.

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New Initiatives

Classified Employee Compensation:

- Salary increases for our non-certified employees have lagged the increases of other similar government employees.
- A 3.0% compensation increase for locally paid non-certified employees would cost \$328,000.



New Initiatives

Certified Employee Compensation:

- Our certified employees have not yet received any increased compensation for this fiscal year due to the budget impasse.
- A 4.0% compensation increase for locally paid certified employees would cost \$139,000.



New Initiatives

Clerical – Custodial Allotment Increase:

- Add 3.5 clerical employees to provide additional coverage at 7 elementary schools
- Add 10.5 custodial positions throughout the district
- Add four schools to the District lawn care program
- The projected local cost would be \$400,000



New Initiatives

College & Career Promise (CCP) Program:

- The popularity of the CCP program has grown substantially over the past several years
- The CCP program is funded by State and local funds
- The anticipated funding gap generated by growth in this program is \$158,000



New Initiatives

A+ School Designation:

- The A+ School designation is awarded by the NC Arts Council to schools that incorporate arts into their teaching and learning
- We currently have one school with the A+ designation and are proposing to add two more
- We are proposing to add two additional schools at a cost of \$100,000

Transportation for New Early College:

- We plan to open our second Early College in FY 2021-22 at the Gaston College Kimbrell campus in Belmont
- Student transportation is a requirement of this type of program
- Based on the transportation cost of our existing Early College, we expect this cost will amount to \$100,000 next year

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
