Superintendent's Comments

Superintendent Booker reported we have started our fourth nine weeks of school. Superintendent Booker thanked students, teachers and support staff for the work they are doing in the classroom.

Superintendent Booker announced that we are making progress with our new payroll system and we appreciate everyone's patience and understanding.

Superintendent Booker announced next week we will be opening the window to select 40 individuals for the "Teacher Assistants to Teachers" program offered through the Superintendent's Leadership Academy. This new program will give our teacher assistants an opportunity to meet the

degree requirements necessary to transition from being a teacher assistant to a classroom teacher, and it is being offered free-of-charge through a partnership with Gaston College, Belmont Abbey College and Gardner-Webb University. Once degree requirements are completed, teachers are required to complete four years of teaching in Gaston County Schools.

Superintendent Booker thanked the 16 students, employees, parents and community members that agreed to represent Gaston County Schools on the "Portrait of a Graduate" design team. The Department of Public Instruction is engaging school-related stakeholders from across the state to provide input/feedback during three virtual sessions this spring that will be used to help develop a "Portrait of a Graduate."

Superintendent Booker reported we have a number of special programs happening at our schools. We encourage the community to support our students as they put on concerts, plays and other activities. Performances are posted on our website.

Superintendent Booker announced the Board of Education committee meetings for April have been canceled and the regular Board of Education meeting will be held on Monday, April 11 at 5:30 p.m. to avoid a conflict with spring break.

Chairman Ramsey wished Mrs. Lovelace a "Happy Birthday."

March 21, 2022

The Operations Committee met on Monday, March 7, 2022 at 4:00pm in the Central Office Board Room. Our committee consists of Chairman – Lee Dedmon, Kevin Collier, Dot Cherry, and Brent Moore.

Our agenda and discussions included the following:

- 1. The committee was updated on the planning process and conceptual elevations for Grier Middle School. LS3P will soon be providing a schematic design.
- 2. Our Chief Communications Officer shared with us an overview of the calendar survey for 2022-2023 school year. The survey was available on the district website, and was sent to parents, students, employees, and community members through our Parentlink communication system. A total of 2,103 people completed the survey. Sample D, the calendar with the first semester ending before winter break, received the most support on the survey with 70% saying they supported it. This item is on the agenda.
- 3. Our Executive Director of Auxiliary Services, Dr. Morgen Houchard, gave us an update on all Auxiliary Services Departments (Transportation, School Nutrition, Facilities and Safety and Security). He also informed us that all departments were assessing and preparing for the recent fuel price increases.
- 4. Associate Superintendent and Chief Financial Officer, Gary Hoskins, informed us that in November 2021 the General Assembly approved the budget. PRC 071 contained money that the Board needs to designate the state teacher/certified instructional support supplement received. The Committee recommends approval from the Board. This item is on the agenda.
- 5. Mr. Hoskins also stated that representatives from CherryRoad have been in Gaston County helping with tasks and issues related to the system. There have been several off cycle checks run with manual checks being written when needed. Finance and HR departments continue to work hard to ensure issues are resolved.
- 6. The Committee reviewed and recommends for approval the Playground Mulch for Pre-K and Elementary Schools contract. The contract will appear on the Consent Agenda.
- 7. In other business, we learned that we may receive a grant for \$169,000 to be used for athletic facilities. Funds will be used for middle school athletic improvements on fields, benches, and other needs as identified. Currently we are working with the county on a New Construction Needs Based Grant and possible funding for infrastructure to connect water to Tryon and Chapel Grove Elementary Schools.

Our next committee meeting is Monday, May 2, 2022 at 4:00pm in the Board Room.

State Mandated Increase in Employer Benefits:

- Next year employer provided benefits is projected to increase by \$445,000 as follows:
 - Health insurance is projected to increase by
 5.4% from \$7,019 to \$7,397;
 - Employer retirement contribution is projected to increase by 5.7% from 22.89% to 24.19%.

Ongoing Expenditures

Replace End-of-Life Student Chromebooks:

- New Chromebooks will be issued to all 6,800 2nd, 6th and 9th grade students each year.
- · Students will keep these same devices each year.
- Cost to replace these 6,800 devices amounts to about \$2.0 million per year.
- This cost will be covered by COVID funds for the next two years.





Teacher Salary Supplements

- Over the past eight years, the County has increased teacher supplements by \$4.18 million
- The State approved an additional salary supplement of \$435 per teacher, net of \$193 in retirement costs, for FY 2021-22
- We are requesting a \$500,000 increase in local teacher supplements for next year

Classified Employee Compensation:

- Classified employees include custodians, bus drivers, administrative support, teacher assistants, etc.
- The State budget provides an increase of the greater of 2.5% or \$15.00 per hour. The impact on our locally paid non-certified employees would be about \$215,000

New Initiatives

Certified Employee Compensation:

- Our certified employees include teachers, guidance counselors, media specialist, etc.
- The State budget provides for an average compensation increase of 2.5% for certified employees. The impact on locally paid certified employees would be about \$116,000

Additional Nursing Positions in Schools:

- Add 30 nursing positions so Gaston County Schools would have one nurse for each of our 55 schools. This would provide immediate and acute medical care to students on all campuses
- The projected cost would be \$1.9 million which would be covered using COVID funds for two years

New Initiatives

Custodial Allotment Increase:

- Added ten school custodial FTEs to reduce the average area cleaned per custodian
- Added four district custodians to provide support to schools when absences and vacancies occur
- The projected cost would be about \$600,000 which would be covered using COVID funds for two years

Teacher Leadership:

- Developing a program to encourage teacher assistants to transition to licensed teachers
- Our goal is to identify 40 candidates for this program
- Tuition and other costs totaling \$335,000 per year would be paid by GCS
- Candidates would teach at GCS for four years

Student Record Retention:

- We have over 1,800 boxes of inactive student records
- Paper records take a significant amount of space to store and are not easily available whereas scanned records are easily assessable and will meet all record retention requirements
- It will cost about \$168,000 per year for three years to scan these records

Additional Employment - HS School Counselors

- GCS School Counselors currently work 10 months
- We are proposing to increase their work schedule to 11 months per year
- They can use this additional time to work on student schedules, transcript review, etc.
- This additional month of employment is expected to cost \$228,000


Additional Employment – MS/HS Athletic Directors

- MS Athletic Directors (ADs) currently work 10 months and HS ADs currently work 11 months
- We are proposing to increase their work schedule to 11 months and 12 months, respectively
- They can use this additional time to work on fields, athletic schedules, hiring coaches, etc.
- This is expected to cost \$110,000




